

SOME REMARKS ON THE CHRONOLOGY AND THE COMPOSITION OF THE BYZANTINE COIN HOARDS FROM THE 13TH AND THE 14TH CENTURIES AT THE LOWER DANUBE AND ADJACENT AREAS

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During the last decades the interest toward the publication of Byzantine coin hoards from the Lower Danube and from the area North of the Balkans became more and more constant and fruitful¹. But a very important source of new information on

the Byzantine currency in this zone may be found even in the pages of numismatic literature by reanalyzing and redating the older discoveries, published many years ago, in the light of most recent achievements in the field of the late Byzantine numismatics. This study is a continuation of our previous work on the 12th century Byzantine coin hoards from the Lower Danube area, published in 1992. It regards a lot of 38 hoards from the 13th to the 14th centuries, published long time ago, using obsolete reference catalogs and some monetary finds only shortly mentioned before or unpublished until now. The author hopes that it should be also useful to put at the disposal of our colleagues the basic data concerning the structure and the dating of some published hoards, but not very easy to use due to the limited circulation of certain numismatic or archaeological periodicals or to the linguistic difficulties.

In many cases we had the opportunity of a direct contact with the unpublished or redated hoards. In other cases we bring up to date the older references, sincerely thinking that, despite the risks of a such an enterprise, the renewed information will be anyway more useful than the possible mistakes, of which we would still be fully conscious.

Following the system used for our publication of *RESEE*, 30, 1992 we give synthetical information about the:

Ionescu, “Monede din Muzeul de Istorie Giurgiu” [*Coins from the Giurgiu Historical Museum*], in BSNR, 67–69, 1973–1975, 121–123, p. 331 were, in fact, part of this hoard.



In the collection of this museum they preserve some coins that look to be a parcel of a hoard from the late 12th–early 13th century. Unfortunately in the access book of the museum any datum about the period of its acquisition is missing. In our opinion it consists of stamena of Manuel I (Constantinople, Hendy 4th coinage, var. A — 1 sp.), Isaac II (Constantinople, Hendy, var. D), Alexius III (Constantinople, var. I — 2 sp. and var. II — 1 sp.), Bulgarian imitative, type B — 1 sp. and type C — 1 sp., Latin imitative, Constantinople, small module, type A — 2 sp.

Probable date of deposition: 1220–1230.
