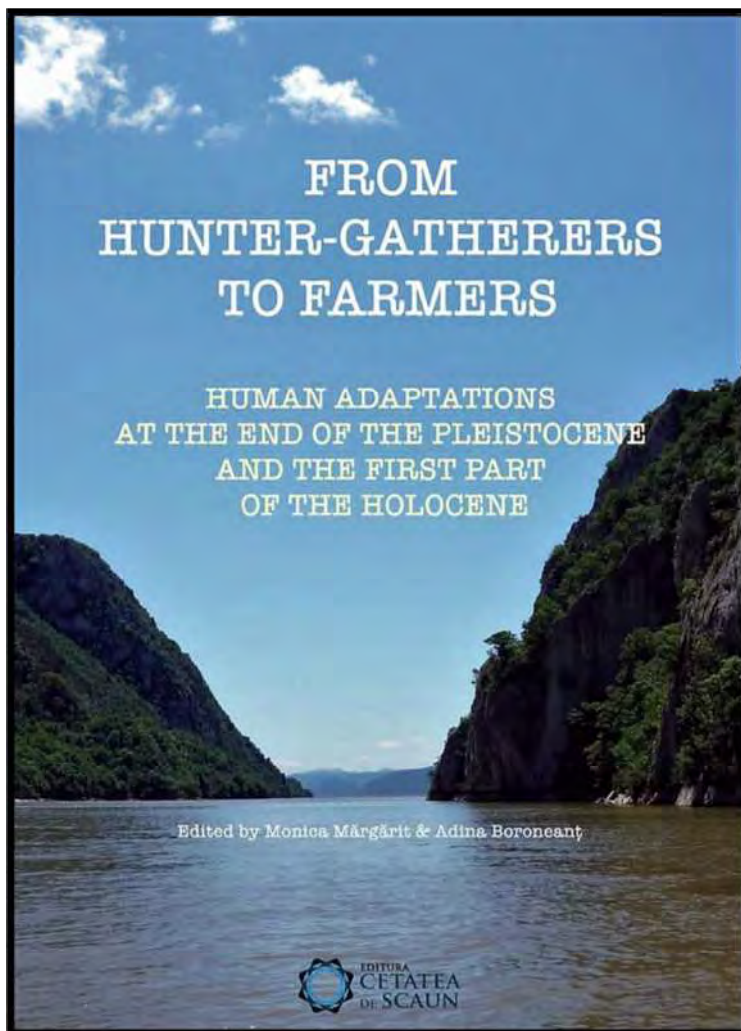

Cu o vastă experiență internațională în domeniul cercetării și arheologiei, dr. Clive Bonsall și-a legat destinul de România, în ultimul deceniu fiind implicat împreună cu dr. Adina Boroneanț, cercetător științific la Institutul de Arheologie „Vasile Pârvan”, din București, în cercetarea sistematică a sitului de la Schela Cladovei, județul Mehedinți, dar și a celorlalte vestigii mezolitice din zona Cazanelor Dunării. Cei interesați de subiect și de perioadă pot găsi în paginile acestui volum o serie de abordări interdisciplinare despre siturile Răzvrata, Peștera Climente II dar și analogii cu descoperirile de la Schela Cladovei, dar și numeroase abordări referitoare la vestigiile similare de peste Dunăre.

Constituită din trei părți, lucrarea cuprinde, după cum am prezentat, abordări specifice zonei Cazanelor Dunării, apoi studii cu caracter regional și se încheie cu studii despre anumite situri preistorice precum *Zemunica Cave*, Croatia, *Grotta dell'Edera*, Northern Italy, *Paks–Gyapa*, Hungary, *Varna I* și *Sarnevo* din Bulgaria, etc. Nu trebuie să surprindă pe nimeni că siturile din România prezintă un interes larg pentru cercetătorii străini deoarece acestea sunt conexe la fenomenele culturale vecine și uneri pot oferi și completa tabloul datelor și cunoștințelor despre mezolitic ori neo-eneoliticul european.

Suntem în posesia unui volum ce poate fi considerat una din bornele cercetării anului 2017 și a aparițiilor editoriale dedicate perioadei și temei și cu atât mai onorantă este reunirea acestor studii într-un volum dedicat profesorului Clive Bonsall.
