

THE CERNAVODĂ III-BOLERÁZ PHENOMENON SOUTH OF THE BALKANS

Several sites situated south of the Balkans, such as: Radomir Vahovo, Vaksevo (southwest Bulgaria) and Hissar (Kosovo) revealed materials directly related to the Cernavodă III-Boleráz phenomenon. Unfortunately, although the materials are characteristic to that cultural phenomenon, they are still few in number. However, the parallels between the Lower and Middle Danube regions with the central Balkan Peninsula, where these sites are situated, are quite impressive. Therefore, in the today stage of investigations, one can say that the Central Balkan Peninsula is fully involved in the Cernavodă III-Boleráz phenomenon through the sites cited above. Its characteristics are, however, still the aim of future investigations.
